REV. EUSTACIA MOFFETT MARSHALL

Since July 2019, Reverend Eustacia Moffett Marshall has been serving as the Pastor of New River Presbyterian Church (Philadelphia, PA), a church replant of three historic congregations (Calvin Presbyterian, First African Presbyterian, and Good Shepherd Presbyterian) who have united to follow God into a new season of ministry. Prior to her pastoral tenure in Philadelphia, she served churches in New Jersey and North Carolina.

Rev. Marshall received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology and a Minor in Human Biology from Stanford University. In May 2006, she received her Master of Divinity Degree from Princeton Theological Seminary where she merited a number of academic and ecclesiastical awards including the Jagow Preaching Prize, the John T. Galloway Prize in Expository Preaching, and the David B. Watermulder Prize in Church Leadership. She is currently a PhD candidate at North Carolina A & T State University in the Leadership Studies and Adult Education doctoral program.

Rev. Marshall's ministry spans many avenues. Prior to Princeton Seminary, she served as a full time music minister. She is a lectionary commentator in the African American lectionary online and has sermons published in the African American Pulpit (Fall 2009) and in the book, "These Sisters Can Say It (Volume 2)," released in April 2014.

She recently concluded her tenure as Chair of the Board of Trustees for the Presbyterian Foundation, which is one of the largest religious foundations in North America. Rev. Marshall is the first black woman to serve this distinguished role in the Foundation's more than 200 year history.

A native of Oakland, California, Rev. Marshall is wife to Rev. Touré C. Marshall, and together they are the proud parents of nine-year old, Jeremiah Touré and six-year old, Jessica Monét.
